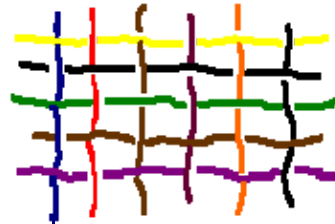

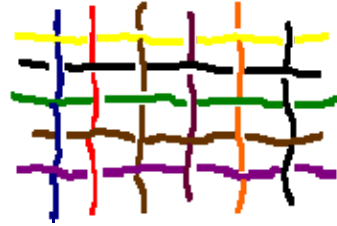

WHAT IS JustLiving?



JustLiving addresses three basic needs.

- **LOW-INCOME FAMILIES ATTAIN A HOME.**
- **YOUTH LEADERSHIP AND EMPLOYMENT THROUGH MENTORING.**
- **VOLUNTEERS EXPERIENCE VISIONS OF JUSTICE THROUGH PRACTICAL MINISTRY.**

LOW-INCOME FAMILIES BECOME HOMEOWNERS

Affordable housing becomes less affordable everyday.

What is devastating about the above statement is that people who do not own their home struggle far more than those who do own a home.

Home ownership though means children who would otherwise live in drafty buildings, with questionable plumbing, and dubious sanitation no longer participate in the struggle to stay healthy.

JustLiving vision is moving children from poverty and homelessness to children who have the opportunity to focus on school, homework, playing, and being family.

YOUTH DEVELOP SKILLS

There is a unique aspect to JustLiving not found in similar projects: To bring the youth of low-income families together with mentors in the creation and construction of affordable housing.

Local youth and young adults work with one another, staff, and mentors to make affordable housing feasible. As a team all work together to: 1. Buy land, 2. Design and create house plans, 3. Pull permits and interface with public agencies, 4. Work with volunteers in constructing an affordable home, and 5. Help families secure financing.

VOLUNTEERS VISION JUSTICE

Volunteers are the key to low-income housing. Labor is the one factor in home construction where anyone and everyone can help. On every build, there is a place and a need for all ages. From framing a wall to providing water for workers, there is a critical need for the skills, passion, and compassion everyone brings to a build!

No matter where one finds themselves, framing or painting, digging or landscaping, sweeping or installing a door, life changing moments occur. In finding mutual relationship with one another, people become aware justice is helping alleviate the hurt of others.
